## Being Clean is Important

I know some asked this morning, or I made the statement of what I was going to be talking about tonight and that sort of flew away somewhere else, as I was in the shower about 5:10 PM. These thoughts came to my mind. We feel confident this is what we need to talk about tonight. Please pray for us.

Isaiah 6:1 In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple.

Isaiah 6:2 Above it stood the seraphims: each one had six wings; with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly.

Isaiah 6:3 And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, *is* the LORD of hosts: the whole earth *is* full of his glory.

Isaiah 6:4 And the posts of the door moved at the voice of him that cried, and the house was filled with smoke.

Isaiah 6:5 Then said I, Woe *is* me! for I am undone; because I *am* a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

Isaiah 6:6 Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, *which* he had taken with the tongs from off the altar:

Isaiah 6:7 And he laid *it* upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged.

Isaiah 6:8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here *am* I; send me.

Isaiah 6:9 And he said, Go, and tell this people, Hear ye indeed, but understand not; and see ye indeed, but perceive not.

Isaiah 6:10 Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed.

Isaiah 6:11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered, Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,

Isaiah 6:12 And the LORD have removed men far away, and *there be* a great forsaking in the midst of the land.

Isaiah 6:13 But yet in it *shall be* a tenth, and *it* shall return, and shall be eaten: as a teil tree, and as an oak, whose substance *is* in them, when they cast *their leaves*: so the holy seed *shall be* the substance thereof.

Isaiah is speaking here about a very sad time in his life. The Bible says here in verse 1, of chapter 6...

Isaiah 6:1 In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple.

He is speaking about the writing here in the year that king Uzziah died. Uzziah was the king. He had been the king for 52 years. He was an individual here that did a lot of good things. The economy prospered. The land, as far as, economically went; things prospered. However, as you read the story, you will find out that Uzziah made some bad choices and bad decisions at the end of his life. We know he died a leper. We know that he did some things he should not have done. There was judgement because of that.

Isaiah is looking around. He is looking around and the throne is empty. He does not know what he is going to do. He knows his king is dead. No doubt, he loved Uzziah. He had a lot of respect for him. Again, no doubt, he was a good man.

I want to say this too. In life, just because somebody messes up one time, let us not let that characterize their whole life. If you do that, then do you know what you will have to do? You will have to take this book and throw it away, because the majority of the people in here all sinned except one of them. Do you know that?

Even though Uzziah made some mistakes; he was a good man. David made some mistakes. The Bible says he was a man after God's own heart.

Therefore, let us not be critical of people because all you have to do is to figure out, and when we start looking at things like that—if we will just go home and look at the mirror and examine ourselves in the mirror—do you know what we will figure out? We will figure out that we have all kinds of issues ourselves. We have all kinds of problems. We have messed up. Therefore, let us not be hard on people when they mess up. Do you know what we should do? We should try to help them, strengthen them, encourage them, and let them know that we have been there and done that. Do you know what you can do? You can get up off of the ground and get back in the race and get on the way.

Isaiah here, no doubt, he is discouraged. It is a bad time. He does not know what is going to happen. He knows enough about things to know that even though the economy is booming, everything is going great like that. He knows that the core of the whole nation is rotten. When you read the story, Isaiah knew that deep down inside the nation, it was rotten.

When we look around in our world today—we may have all kinds of money. We may have all kinds of stuff in this life. However, I want you to understand something. We are in trouble today as a nation. We are in trouble as a nation, when we look around and what all is going on, and all the things that are happening on every corner of the world. There is a lot of sin going on.

Here is something we want to look at tonight. The Bible says here...

Isaiah 6:1 In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple.

Do you know what God always does? Listen. If you really want to follow the Lord, if you really want to serve Him—do you know what God knows? God knows that there are going to be dark times. God knows that there is going to be times in our life that we do not know where to go or what we need to do or how we need to turn. However, do you know what God wants you and me to do? In those times when we do not have the answers, in our times we cannot look to our government for answers. Do you know what God wants us to do? God wants us to look up at Him. Do you know what? If we will look up at Him then we will get a totally different situation and a different picture when we look at things from heaven's point of view.

Here on earth in Jerusalem, there was not a king. It was a sad time. He was dead. He was gone. He was not coming back. There was a lot of unrest going on. Do you know what Isaiah only had to do? He only had to lift up his eyes and look toward heaven and when he saw heaven, there was no unrest in heaven. Everything was under control in heaven. Do you know why? It is because the God we serve; He is always under control. He is never out of control. He knows what is going on. If we will just look to Him in times of trouble, He will always take care of us.

The Bible says, he sees Him here sitting upon the throne. That is where he sees the Lord at. He looks into heaven. He sees this vision. He sees the Lord sitting upon the throne. The Bible says He is high and lifted up. The Bible says that His train filled the whole place, the whole temple.

Do you know when Isaiah sees the Lord? He is sitting on the throne. Listen. There is a God tonight that is in control. He is omnipotent. He is the sovereign God and He is the One in control. He knew exactly what was going on in Jerusalem. He knew exactly that Uzziah had died. That did not concern Him one bit because He was in control. He was sitting on a throne. He was high and lifted up. The Bible says that His train, His presence filled the whole place.

Listen. We serve a great big God tonight. We serve a God tonight that is big enough to take care of your problems and mine at the same time.

Here is what is going to happen. The Lord knew what Isaiah needed. The Lord knew that he needed to see Him.

Troubles in life—do you know what we do so much? Instead of looking to Christ, we look at the problems. We look at the sickness. We look at all the things that are going on. We look at not having any money, not having a job, this and that; we look at all the problems but do you know what we do not do? We do not look to Him.

Get this. When we look to Him, then we are going to get a different picture of really what is going on.

Isaiah 6:2 Above it stood the seraphims: each one had six wings; with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly.

When you look at these seraphims, the word means fiery ones. Burning ones. These angelic beings, do you know what they were doing? They were there in the temple. They were praising the God of heaven. They were saying holy, holy, holy Lord God Almighty. This was their job to praise the God of heaven. He is there. He is lifted up. He is sitting on a throne. His train is filling the room. The angelic beings are there and they do this day and night. They cry holy, holy, holy Lord God Almighty. Even the angels praise the God of heaven. They praise Him.

Do you know what we should be doing? Even in our times of distress, we need to be praising God. We should be looking at Him because He is the One that is going to get us through. He is the One that is going to rescue us. He is the One that is going to save us and give us what we need to make it through whatever it is we are going through. I am not going to make it myself. I cannot make it myself. Neither can you.

Isaiah 6:3 And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, *is* the LORD of hosts: the whole earth *is* full of his glory.

Isaiah 6:4 And the posts of the door moved at the voice of him that cried, and the house was filled with smoke.

Do you know what? That would have been awesome sight to see. Would it not? That would have been an awesome sight to see. Here your heart is broken. You do not know what you are going to do. You do not know what is going to happen to the nation. You do not know how things are going to go. You know there is sin. You know there are problems. You know people have turned away from God.

Sometimes I feel a little bit like Isaiah felt. When we look around sometimes, in this world we live in today; people do not want to hear the Word of God. They do not want to hear the truth. They want to hear fables. They want to hear things that will make them feel good. Tell me how good I am preacher. Tell me I am going to go to heaven.

Do you know what? Listen. Someone sent me a little picture the other day that said something like this, "Live right so the preacher won't have to lie at your funeral." There is a lot to that. You talk to everybody today, when you talk about funerals and preaching funerals; do you know what everybody wants you to do? They want you to

tell everybody their family went to heaven. Do you know what? I cannot do that. I am not going to do that. If you did not leave a testimony behind then I am not going to tell a crowd of people that you are on your way to heaven. Do you know what I would be? I would be guilty. I would stand before God guilty. I am not going to do that.

I preached a funeral one day, a man got mad at me. I do not think he ever spoke to me from that day forward. A man died. He was unsaved. He never went to church. He never had a testimony about God. He never did anything remotely to worship God. I made this statement. I said, "Hey, if we could talk to him today, do you know what he would tell us? He would tell us he would pay us to worship and to live right and serve the God of heaven." Do you know he got mad about that?

Listen. If we could talk to the dead today, whether they are in heaven or whether they are in hell, they would tell us that we had better serve the God of heaven because both places are real. Same fellow at the funeral, tell everybody my dad went to heaven. Tell everybody that he is up there and doing all this stuff. I said, "Sir, I can't do that."

Listen. We need to live right today. Amen! We need to live right. Anyway. The Bible says...

Get this. He sees the Lord—get this—this vision changes him. He sees the Lord. He sees Him. He sees Him high and lifted up. He sees the whole temple filled with smoke. He sees the posts moving and rocking. He sees all of that and do you know what it does? It causes him to look inside of himself.

Get this. If you want to see who you really are and be honest; if you really want to see who you are and see how good you are doing, if you will be honest with yourself and honest with God then get this Bible out and turn over to the gospel of John, chapter 1. You start reading a few chapters out loud so you can hear. Do you know what you will figure out? You will figure out really quick that we are not quite as good as what we think we are.

Listen. Do you know what this Word will show us? It will show us how holy God really is. It will show us how sinful we really are. Isaiah saw the Lord high and lifted up. His train was filling the whole room. The smoke was there. The doors were shaking. The seraphims were praising God—holy, holy, holy Lord God Almighty. Do you know what happens here? The Bible says in verse 5...

Isaiah 6:5 Then said I, Woe *is* me! for I am undone; because I *am* a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

Do you know why he said that? Because he understood how holy God was and how sinful he was. How that his nation had sinned. How that he had sinned. How that they had walked away from the God of heaven.

Listen.

Isaiah 6:5 Then said I, Woe *is* me! for I am undone; because I *am* a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

Listen. When we have unclean lips, it is a perfect picture that we have an unclean heart. Because from our mouth...from our heart...we speak words from our heart. When Isaiah said, I am undone. I am a man of unclean lips. He understood that he had an unclean heart. He saw these things because he had taken a look at the Lord.

Do you know why people will not look at the Lord today? It convicts them. He convicts them. He shows them their sin. He shows them they are wrong. They do not want to hear preaching. They do not want to read their Bible. They do not want to do that. It shows us the error of our way.

I am glad for that. Are you? I am glad that I have a God that loves me enough that gave me a book to read that shows me and tells me I need to straighten up. Amen! That is true folks. No one in here has any halos. Nope. That is for sure.

He sees here that he is undone. He sees the Lord and the next thing he sees is himself.

How long has it been since we have examined ourselves? Really! How long has it been since we have taken the Bible and sat down and read it and prayed and ask God to search us? Search us. Lord show me who I am. Show me Lord how good I am doing. Show me Lord, where I stand with you. Show me Lord. Let me know. How long?

Examining ourselves is a good thing. Allowing the Lord to examine us is a better thing. Do you know what? He will give us an examination that is right. He will look at everything on the inside of us. He sees it all. When we examine ourselves sometimes, we only want to look at the good things. Do you know what He does? He looks at the whole man.

Isaiah is looking at the whole guy here. He says, "Lord, I am in a mess. Judgement is on the way." Woe means judgement. Judgement is on the way. He says here, I am undone. I am a man of unclean lips.

Get this. He says...

Isaiah 6:5 Then said I, Woe *is* me! for I am undone; because I *am* a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

Do you know what he is saying here? He says here; I have seen the Lord. I have seen Him. I looked into this temple there. I saw this vision that God gave me. I saw how holy and righteous He is. Because of that I see who I am. I know I am not living right. I know I have some issues that are going on that I need some help with. Not only me but I am living in a realm of people, in a nation of people of unclean lips. Do you know

what Isaiah was able to see? He was being very honest with himself and with God. He understood that he was in trouble. He understood that if God did not come and cleanse him then judgement was on its way. He understood that if God did not forgive the people then they were going to be in trouble.

However, do you know what God is going to do here? God is going to do something for Isaiah. He is going to do something for him. He is going to use him to try to persuade other people to turn around.

Listen. When we will get a picture, when we will get a glimpse of heaven and when we will look and see who Jesus Christ really is and then we look at ourselves and see that we are wicked and undone and that our lips are unclean then we are getting in a good place that we can be forgiven.

I am glad when God saved us and when Jesus died. Not only did He die to save me and forgive me of my sins, back there; but even today we have an advocate with the Father, which is Jesus Christ...which is the propitiation for our sins. Not for our sins only, but for the sins of the whole world. Today, when I will confess my sins; do you know what Jesus Christ will do? He will forgive me and you too. Amen!

Isaiah knew that. Isaiah knew he needed help. Isaiah knew that he was in a mess and that he was in trouble.

That is hard for us to admit today, that we need help. That is hard for us to admit that we are in trouble, especially us men. We have it all figured out and think we do not need any help sometimes. Some of you women too. I do not want to make you guys feel left out. Sometimes we think that we have it all figured out and we do not need any help. We are going to make it on our own. We have it all worked out. However, we wake up one day in a mess. We are in way over our head.

Isaiah sees the Lord and the next thing Isaiah sees is he sees himself in a mess.

Isaiah 6:6 Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, *which* he had taken with the tongs from off the altar:

Isaiah 6:7 And he laid *it* upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged.

Do you know what happens? Isaiah sees himself. He confesses his sins. Lord I am in a mess. If you do not forgive then I am in a total mess. The people are in a mess. We have sinned. We have walked away from you. We know what your laws, your statutes, and judgements are. We have walked away from those things Lord.

Get this. This is an important thought about all of this. I did not think about this until just a few minutes ago. One of the seraphims were here that had been praising God. It was important enough to him—get this—to stop what he was doing and go over and get the tongs and pick up one of the live coals of fire that was burning on the altar and stop praising God. It was important enough for him to do this. Take this live coal and come

back over and touch Isaiah's lips and to cleanse him, purge him, or forgive him. That is the lesson here.

Listen. If it was so important for this seraphim that was praising God—that was their responsibility day and night—to stop what he was doing to go over and to cleanse Isaiah's lips; do you know what that tells me? For me to be clean is important. Amen! For you to be clean is important.

The Bible says this. That is what he did. He touches him. Do you know what it says here?

Isaiah 6:6 Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, *which* he had taken with the tongs from off the altar:

Isaiah 6:7 And he laid *it* upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged.

Isaiah, you are cleaned up now. Isaiah saw the Lord. Isaiah sees himself. The angel comes, takes the coal, touches his lips, forgives him, cleanses him, purges his sins. Now something is going to happen now.

Here is what I want us all to see in this thought. The Bible says...

Isaiah 6:8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here *am* I; send me.

Now he has been dealing with the seraphims. He has been hearing the seraphims crying holy, holy, holy. The seraphim had come and touched him, cleansed him and purged him. Now not only did he see the Lord, but *now he hears the Lord*.

The Bible says here...

Isaiah 6:8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here *am* I; send me.

You see that? That is where we need to be in life. That is where we need to get to in life. If we will really see the Lord and how great and how mighty, and how powerful and how holy and how great He really is and be honest with ourselves; then we will see ourselves as being people that are undone. We will see ourselves as people that needs to be forgiven. We will see ourselves as people that has unclean lips. We will see ourselves as people who needs to be purged from our sins. When we will admit that and confess our sins; do you know what God will do? He will forgive us and cleanse us.

Get this. The next thing He is going to ask you is "Are you ready to go? I have a job for you. I have forgiven you. I have cleansed you. I have taken away the penalty and punishment of your sin, the judgement of the world was upon you. I took that away. You are cleansed now. Now I have a job that I need done. Now I need somebody to go and preach. Now I need somebody to go and tell people. Now I need somebody to go out here and tell people it is time to turn from your sins."

Listen. That is everyone of our jobs. I know this world we live in especially in the church age today, everybody thinks everything is the preacher's job. Whatever it is; it is the preacher's job.

Listen. It is your job. It is everyone's job to tell people about the goodness of Almighty God and also to warn people that judgement is on its way. Amen! That is our responsibility. Read the book. Read what Jesus told the disciples. Read what Jesus told them in the book of Acts. That is our responsibility is to go out and teach people and to preach unto people, baptize people and get people ready to go to heaven. That is our responsibility. If we do not do that then what are we doing? Why are we here? What is the purpose? If we just come to church and sit and do nothing else the rest of the week; what is our purpose? I am not mad. I am just asking a question. What are we doing for the kingdom of God? Are we changing people's lives? We are one way or the other.

I thought about this today or yesterday. I never saw a time when so many people are teaching their kids to be dishonest. Teaching their kids to be corrupt. Teaching their kids to hate. That is the one that really disturbs me in the last couple of days. Teaching little kids 10, 12, 14, 16, 18 years old to hate. They hate people so they teach their kids to hate people.

Listen. There is a real day of judgement coming and people are going to answer for that. People are going to answer for that. Little children, they think mommy and daddy will always tell them right. Do you know what? Mommy and daddy is not always teaching right. Amen!

Isaiah saw what was going on here. He saw himself unclean. He saw himself having unclean lips. The seraphim come and purged his sins. The seraphim cleaned him up. Then the Lord says, "Hey, I need someone to go. I have a job for you. I need someone to go."

Isaiah 6:8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here *am* I; send me.

Are you willing to do that? Are you willing to go and do what God asked you to do? He may not ask you to go to India, Africa, or some foreign nation. He might. But are you simply willing to take one little small step for God? You have to be clean first. You have to be cleaned up first. He is not going to ask you to do anything until you get cleaned up. Amen! Living in your sin; God is not going to ask you to do anything for Him. So, you have to get cleaned up. The call came, the invitation came, the instruction came to work after he got cleaned up; not before he got cleaned up. Amen!

He says who can we send? Who will go? Isaiah said, I will go.

Are we willing to do that? Are we willing to take that step? Are we willing to take that one little small step when God says I have a job for you? Will you do it? I have a job for you. Who wants to volunteer? I have a job for you. I want to bless you. One little step

of faith and one little step of obedience leads to two steps of obedience and three steps and so on... You wake up one day, and you have been faithful to God all of your life. That is what God wants out of us.

It has to start somewhere folks. Do you know where it needs to start, and when it needs to start? Now! It needs to start now. You have influence with people on your job, the people you are around, your neighbors, the kids you go to school with that I will never see or Deb will never see and so on... Those are people you need to deal with. Those are people that God is saying, hey, take a step of faith. Ask them have they ever trusted Jesus. Ask them if they would like to trust Jesus? Ask them if they would like to be born again. Talk to them. Do you know what you will find out? You will get a few smart answers. You will get a few people that are going to tell you shut your mouth. I do not want to hear it. Do you know what? That is okay.

There is some little saying about sticks and stones that comes to mind when you think about that. However, that is not going to hurt us. Listen. People are dying. We have our minds on everything else, except trying to persuade people to get right with God.

Quiet, isn't it? Do you know why it should be? It is my family and it is your family. I have three brothers that are lost. Good men. They are lost. On their way to a lake of fire. We could probably go down the pews here, do you know what we would find out? Probably in every family, there is more than one, two or ten that are dying lost.

The Lord simply asked Isaiah, who is going to go. Isaiah said, "Lord, send me. Here I am. Send me."

Isaiah 6:9 And he said, Go, and tell this people, Hear ye indeed, but understand not; and see ye indeed, but perceive not.

Isaiah 6:10 Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed.

Do you know what He says? Isaiah go. I want you to go. This is what I want you to tell them. I want you to go and preach to them. Isaiah, they are not going to hear you. The masses are not going to hear you. Their hearts are going to be fat. Their ears are going to turn a deaf ear. They are not going to listen to you. However, you go.

Here is the thing guys. I am not going to be responsible for all the people that I have witnessed to and talked to that did not make things right with God. I am not going to be responsible for them anymore. You will not either. The people you talk to and witness to and try to persuade to get right with God; if they die lost that is on them. However, it is our responsibility to tell them. It is our responsibility to talk to them. It is our responsibility to get out of our comfort zone. Not to be so comfortable. To put all this other stuff aside that does not really matter. It is all going to burn up. It is all going to pass away. Our children, grandchildren and neighbors are going to be burning in hell.

Isaiah 6:11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered, Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,

Lord, how long do you want me to do this. How long? How long do you want me to go and preach to people who are not going to hear me? How long do you want me to go and preach to people that their hearts are going to be fat, their ears are going to be dull? They are not going to listen to me. How long, Lord, do you want me to do that?

Look what it says...

Isaiah 6:11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered, Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,

Do you know what that means? As long as there is any, as long as there is one person in the city; you preach to them Isaiah.

Do you know what God knew? Isaiah is probably writing here in 750 or 740 maybe. Do you know what God knew? Maybe 20 or 30 years, God knew that the Assyrians were going to come. They were going to come and carry off the northern tribes. God knew that. God knew it was not going to be very long that the cities were going to be laid waste. God knew it was not going to be very long that they all were going to be gone. He says, Isaiah, you preach. You tell them...

Isaiah 6:11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered, Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,

“You preach, Isaiah. Tell them.” We get hung up on numbers sometimes. We do not think if we do not have a hundred, or five-hundred then we cannot do anything. Do you know how it starts? With one person. Talking to one person. Then that person gets saved and they talk to another person. This one. This one. And that one. That is how revivals starts. Do you know that?

A few years ago, a little 10 to 14-year-old boy went to the pastor one time and said, “I think we should have a revival.” The pastor was a little bit reluctant. True story. The pastor was a little bit reluctant. After awhile the kid goes back to him and says, “Hey, I think we need to have a revival.” At that church and at that time they one had service a week on a Sunday morning. That is all they had. They would meet for an hour and a half and they would not meet again until the next Sunday morning. The kid about the second or third time; the pastor finally agreed. I do not know whether he was embarrassed or for sure. However, he agreed to have a revival. They got a guy to come in from way up north somewhere. His last name was Greene to preach. Here is what happened. Because of one little kid, one little boy there were probably 30 to 50 people saved because of that. Revival started. People get saved. Do you know what happens? They go home and tell dad and mom, “Hey, I got saved.” They go home and

tell their neighbors or their friends “Hey, I got saved.” In a little building that went from just having a handful of people for a long time; God really blessed. They went from having to one service a week to having three services a week.

It started with one kid, with one young man that had a desire to see his family saved. Do you know who that can be? That can be you. That can be me.

Isaiah 6:11 Then said I, Lord, how long? And he answered, Until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate,

Isaiah 6:12 And the LORD have removed men far away, and *there be* a great forsaking in the midst of the land.

Isaiah 6:13 But yet in it *shall be* a tenth, and *it* shall return, and shall be eaten: as a teil tree, and as an oak, whose substance *is* in them, when they cast *their leaves*: so the holy seed *shall be* the substance thereof.

Here is the thing. We can make a difference. You can make a difference. You can do that. You can make a difference. In your family, your children, your co-workers, your neighbors... First of all, you have to see the Lord, and Him high and lifted up. See how holy and righteous that He is. Second of all, look at yourself. See that you need to be cleansed. When you get cleansed and get straightened up; look around at all the people that are dying. You will see a world that needs you. You will see a world that needs your help. You will see a world that needs our help. Amen! Let us get after it. Let us get to it. Let us not waste any more time. Let us not waste any more time. Do you know why? We may not have much time. Your family may not have much time. My family may not have much time. Today is the day when people needs to repent.

Wherever you are at tonight, in this building, listening to me around the world; wherever you are at this evening, if God is speaking, if God is calling, if God is knocking this would be a great time for you to come and call upon the Lord. He loves you. He died for you. He went outside the city of Jerusalem one day, and there they nailed Him on a tree at a place called Golgotha, a place that looked like an old skull. They nailed Him there. He died. He shed His precious blood that we could be saved. Come tonight.
