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SERMON TRANSCRIPTION

There is Only ONE Way

Wednesday, March 13, 2019

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- Genesis 28:10 And Jacob went out from Beersheba, and went toward Haran.
- Genesis 28:11 And he lighted upon a certain place, and tarried there all night, because the sun was set; and he took of the stones of that place, and put *them* for his pillows, and lay down in that place to sleep.
- Genesis 28:12 And he dreamed, and behold a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it.
- Genesis 28:13 And, behold, the LORD stood above it, and said, I *am* the LORD God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed;
- Genesis 28:14 And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth, and thou shalt spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south: and in thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed.
- Genesis 28:15 And, behold, I *am* with thee, and will keep thee in all *places* whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land; for I will not leave thee, until I have done *that* which I have spoken to thee of.
- Genesis 28:16 And Jacob awaked out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this place; and I knew *it* not.
- Genesis 28:17 And he was afraid, and said, How dreadful *is* this place! this *is* none other but the house of God, and this *is* the gate of heaven.
- Genesis 28:18 And Jacob rose up early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put for his pillows, and set it up for a pillar, and poured oil upon the top of it.
- Genesis 28:19 And he called the name of that place Bethel: but the name of that city was called Luz at the first.
- Genesis 28:20 And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on,
- Genesis 28:21 So that I come again to my father's house in peace; then shall the LORD be my God:

Genesis 28:22 And this stone, which I have set *for* a pillar, shall be God's house: and of all that thou shalt give me I will surely give the tenth unto thee.

The Bible is a book about families. When you read, you can read about so many different families in the Bible. The thing about the Bible is that God is a God that just does not tell us all the good things that families did, but He also tells us the bad things that people did. That is very wise on God's part. I think if God told us, or gave us a book here and everybody in this book always did right then when I looked at my life and compared it to them, then I would be an absolute wreck. Wouldn't you?

We all mess up. He not only wrote about the victories and the great times and the things that people did that brought glory to Him; but He also tells us about the mess ups, the failures, and the sin that so many people did and so many families did. Sometimes we think that when we do sin, and we do, everyone of us; we mess up. We sin. We call it shortcomings. We call it a lot of things.

However, in life, if you have been saved very long; you have sinned. You have messed up. Sometimes when you do that, we think that God doesn't love us anymore, and we are done, doomed and damned. We think we have no hope. We go through this whole gamma of things—and we are going to talk about some of those things in a minute. However, that is the wrong thing to think. If that is the case then nobody is going to go to heaven. You would have to be perfect to go to heaven, then none of us is going to make it. There is only one perfect fellow, His name is Jesus. We know they hung Him on a tree.

The story I want to talk about tonight is about Jacob. I want to touch on Esau for a moment. We know they were brothers. We know you can read and do some studying on their names; it tells you a lot about people during this time and Jacob and Esau. Even when these boys' mother had conceived, she was having issues and troubles. She goes to the Lord and inquires of the Lord. The Lord tells her that she has two nations and two people in her womb. He also tells her that the elder was going to serve the younger. That was just the reverse of what it should have been. The younger should have served the elder but God said before these boys were ever born that the elder is going to serve the younger. That is in the book. We know that God had already ordained that. Since that was the case a lot of things that Jacob was going to do and did do with his mother didn't need to be done because God had already said the elder was going to serve the younger. That was the story. God was going to bring it about.

However, sometimes in life—a smart fellow wrote one time—that living a life of faith; we don't need to scheme or try to plot things when we are living by faith. We don't need to do that.

We know that Jacob bought Esau's birthright. Don't we? We know that Esau was an outdoor guy. He was no doubt, a rough and tough guy that liked to hunt and to fish and

be outside in the dirt. We know that Jacob was probably a mommy's boy. He liked to be inside. He didn't like to go out much. We know that Esau's out and He's been hunting. We know that he comes in hungry. Jacob is cooking some stuff. We know that Esau thinks he is going to die. He wants some of the food that Jacob has cooked. Jacob said that is okay, I'll give you some but you have to give me your birthright. You have to sell me your birthright.

The birthright then was something that was very special. The birthright was given to the eldest son. When the father passed away, he would get two portions of whatever the father had. Above that, he was the spiritual leader of the family. He was the one that was to lead the rest of the family in spiritual things.

As you read the story, Esau cared nothing about spiritual things. He sold his birthright just for something to eat. He just threw it all away. The spiritual influence he could have had; he just threw it all away. It did not mean anything to him, just for something to eat.

I think sometimes in our church world, we are doing the same thing today. We are casting out way too cheaply and we are throwing in the towel way too cheaply on things that do not matter.

We also know that is what Esau did. We also know that as time passed and evidently—as I read the scriptures—they thought that Isaac was going to die. He probably thought he was. He was going to bless his sons. He called them in; Esau and Jacob. We know that their mother devised a plan for Jacob. They were going to deceive Isaac. Isaac was old and could not see. We know that is what they did. We know that she devised a plan; we are going to get your dad to bless you and pronounce the blessing upon you instead of upon Esau. That is what they did. They deceived Isaac into thinking that Jacob was Esau. He pronounced the blessing upon him. When it was done, it was done. Then it was figured out when Esau comes in with his food and was going to give it to Isaac so that Isaac could bless him, then he understood that he had been deceived.

We know when you read the story that Esau gets angry. He goes into a rage. He makes the statement, "...when my dad is dead, and the time of mourning is over; then I am going to kill. I am going to get rid of him." That was the plan. When Jacob's mother found that out, she decides to do something. She gets to thinking in her mind, "I have to do something here to make sure that Esau does not kill Jacob." We know she devises a plan. She is going to send him down to get a wife. That was the plan. That is what they were going to do. However, the whole thing was that she was afraid that Esau was going to kill Jacob.

When you read the whole story, when you read about what is happening here; it is a story... If you have ever seen or read about a dysfunctional family; it was them. If you have ever read about a family that was dived; it was them. If you ever read about a family that had all kinds of issues that you could imagine; this family had them. They had them.

Here is what happens. Here is the story, I read to you in chapter 28. Rebecca are going to send Jacob away. He is going to travel. He is going to go hunt a wife or that is what the plan is. If you read the Bible and you do a little bit of studying; you will find out something. For years, I probably did not know this and probably did not think much about it. When I read the story, I thought that Jacob must have been a young fellow. However, when you read the story and see what happens and put it all together; Jacob is probably close to 80 years old here before he ever leaves his mom. Jacob is close to 80 years old in my understanding, in my studies; he is close to 80 before he ever leaves home.

What I read to you in chapter 28, he leaves. The Bible says he leaves Beersheba. He went out from Beersheba and he went toward Haran.

Genesis 28:10 And Jacob went out from Beersheba, and went toward Haran.

Genesis 28:11 And he lighted upon a certain place, and tarried there all night, because the sun was set; and he took of the stones of that place, and put *them* for his pillows, and lay down in that place to sleep.

As I read to you, he comes to a place called Bethel. Bethel is about 70 miles from Beersheba. Here he is. He knows why he had to leave. He knows he has lied. He knows that he has deceived. He knows what all that he has done; he has done wrong. Now he is on the run. He is on the run. He comes to a place 70 miles away. In my mind I think he is worn out. He does not know where Esau is at. He does not know what is going to happen. He knows he has sinned. He knows he has done wrong. He knows that his mother has done wrong and he is on the run. He is trying to get away from Esau. He is trying to get away and let Esau calm down so that they won't kill him.

Here is what I want to talk about just for a moment. Everyone of us has been here. I wrote down a whole bunch of stuff today. As I read about Jacob, where he is at; he is out here at night. The city of Luz was close there. He did not go to the city. No doubt, he was scared that if Esau was coming that is where he would look for me at. Therefore, I am going to sleep on the hillside. I am going to sleep on the hillside over here. I thought about he is running, how he is traveling and how he is trying to get away and how fearful he must have been.

In life, if we would all be honest—some of these I am going to read off to you here tonight—everyone of us in life, there have been times that we have been here. Some of these experiences that I am going to read off here tonight—I think Jacob was experiencing most of them while he was on the run—the first thing was fear. There have been times in my life and in your life that you have experienced fear. “Not knowing.” He did not know where Esau was at. He did not know how many people Esau had chasing him. He did not know what was going to happen. He was afraid. Not only that but also, he was ashamed.

Have you ever sinned and were ashamed of what you had done? Have you ever done wrong and were ashamed of what you had done? I'm sure we all have. If not then I worry about you. Do you know why? Because we all sin. We all mess up. If our sin does not make us feel ashamed then we have some major issues.

Not only that but also, I could imagine his loneliness. As I read this story, I mean this, I think Jacob was a mommy's boy. He liked to be around mommy. Mommy took care of him. Now he is out here on the hillside all by himself. He is lonely.

Have you ever been lonely? Men don't like to admit that we get lonely. Come on guys! Your wives know you do. We do, and women get lonely. Not only that but some of these things grips our hearts sometimes. Some of these experiences grip our heart. We feel down. We feel not only lonely but also all alone.

He was all alone. He was by himself. He thought. He thought he was by himself. As far as, any person; he was by himself. However, God was close by. Even though he had sinned, even though he had messed up, even though he did all that he did; God was still yet close by. Amen!

Not only that but also, he was afraid. He felt threatened. He felt rejected. He probably felt defeated. He probably felt discouraged. I would have been, if I would have been there. Wouldn't you? I would think, "Nobody wants me." I would have felt unaccepted. I have sinned against God. I have sinned against my brother. I have sinned against my father. I have sinned. I have messed up. I feel unaccepted. I feel useless. I feel helpless, hopeless, embarrassed, shut out and I don't have any purpose in life. I am ashamed, discouraged, and don't know what to do.

If we would have been there; I think Jacob felt some of these things and experienced some of these things.

In life, as we go through life; there will be times that we will feel this way. We will feel useless, and helpless. Sometimes life makes us feel hopeless. We get discouraged. We feel as though we have been abused. We have all these experiences, and we have all these feelings in life—I think we all face them.

Sometimes—keep in mind, all the things that Jacob was experiencing, he brought on himself. Because of his irresponsible behavior and his sin; all the things and all the experiences that he was experiencing, he had brought them all on himself. Again, I think that adds to how we feel sometimes, and how we get ourselves into a spiritual shape sometimes. We know that we are the one who sinned. We brought all this on ourselves. If we had not done that then we would not be here, and that compounds things in life.

Do you know what? There is an answer. His name is Jesus.

Here he is suffering and going through all these things. The Bible says he has traveled here. He gets to Bethel. This is where he is going to be at, but he is traveling towards Haran. He lights upon a certain place...

Genesis 28:11 And he lighted upon a certain place, and tarried there all night, because the sun was set; and he took of the stones of that place, and put *them* for his pillows, and lay down in that place to sleep.

I probably would say if I could lay my head down on a rock and go to sleep, I would be pretty tired. Wouldn't you? I would probably be pretty tired. I would say he was worn out. A 70-mile trip would take at least 2 days or 3 days. They traveled about 20 miles a day walking. Therefore, a little over 2 ½ days maybe, or 3 ½ days. He would have been worn out. He was fearful. He was in a hurry. He probably did not take time to rest. Esau is after me. I have sinned. I have messed up. Death has followed me. I am all alone. I am in the dark. I don't know where to go. No body cares about me. Mom's not here any longer. Dad is not going to defend me. What am I going to do?

He comes to a certain place. He gets him some rocks together and makes a pillow. He lays down and goes to sleep.

Some of the greatest understanding that I have had about spiritual things have happened while I have been asleep. I'm not going to get into what. It doesn't really matter. I know sometimes we have dreams. I know sometimes it is because we ate too much pizza before we go to bed. I understand that. We are not going to go down that trip. I am going to tell you this much. Jacob is going to get to see something here on this night that he never thought he could see.

Listen. It doesn't matter what we are going through in life. It does not matter. It does not matter if we are like Jacob that we have sinned. Whatever it is we have done; we have deceived. We have used deception. We have plotted. We have schemed. Jacob and his mother did all of that.

Here is the thing I want you to remember. God is not somewhere out there that He can't be found. God is not somewhere out there that you cannot be touched. God is not somewhere out there where He has forgotten about you. Jesus Christ died for you. Jesus Christ died for Jacob. Even though he did what he did and sinned as he sinned and he messed up and did all of that; God still had a plan for Jacob's life. God was going to use Jacob in a great way. We think and the devil tries to make us believe, and we allow him to convince us sometimes that when we sin we are done. God could never use us. God could never bless us. God could never forgive us. That is wrong. Read about the great men of the Bible and do you know what you will find out? They sinned. God forgave them. God blessed them. Do you know what? They turned a page on a new beginning and they moved forward. God used them in a great way.

One of the greatest of all time is Peter. That is the greatest story in the book about forgiveness, or one of the greatest stories. About some body that cursed and swore

and just a few hours before Jesus was going to die; he did not even know who He is. Yet, God forgave Him. Jesus forgave him and used him in a tremendous way. Here he is on a pillow. The Bible says in verse 12, he had a dream.

Genesis 28:12 And he dreamed, and behold a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it.

Now here is the staircase, when you read some of the original manuscripts; the word could have been used for staircase or ladder. It is the same thing. This ladder, this staircase reached from earth to heaven or vice versa. Jacob is going to see something here, and we need to understand something here. That this ladder is a wonderful symbol, or picture here of Jesus Christ. There is only one way for mankind to get from earth to heaven and that is by Jesus Christ. He is the way.

When you read the gospel of John chapter 1, and go down to verse 43 or something and read several verses. It will tell you what I'm telling you there. It is talking about the same thing. He is the way. He is the only way. He is going to see here that to be able to get from earth to heaven there is only one way—this ladder. The Bible says this...

Genesis 28:12 And he dreamed, and behold a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven: and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it.

Here you are asleep, with your head on a rock. You traveled 70 miles without taking much time to rest. You are worn out and you see a ladder. The bottom of it is on the earth. The top of it is in heaven. You see the angels of God ascending and descending going back from heaven to earth on this ladder. Do you have that picture? That is what Jacob had seen. He saw the angels come back and forth between heaven and earth, on this staircase, or on this ladder.

Genesis 28:13 And, behold, the LORD stood above it, and said, I *am* the LORD God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed;

Here Jacob is asleep with his head on a rock. Here is the staircase. Here is the ladder. The top of it in heaven, and the bottom on earth. The angels are ascending and descending. It is no coincidence that the Lord is standing at the top. It is no coincidence at all. That is where the Lord was at. The Bible says here, I read to you here; the Lord stood above it.

Get this. Here is something that we Baptist don't even like to talk about.

Genesis 28:13 And, behold, the LORD stood above it, and said, I *am* the LORD God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed;

God is still yet speaking. God is still a real God. God is still yet speaking. Just as He spoke to Jacob and many others down through the Bible. God is still yet speaking today. God is not dead.

Genesis 28:13 And, behold, the LORD stood above it, and said, I *am* the LORD God of Abraham thy father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon thou liest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed;

That was the message. Here you are. You are scared to death. You are lonely. You are afraid. You are upset. You feel useless. You have sinned. You have messed up. You have made life miserable. You have done all of that. Here you are—you have left home. Mom is not there to tuck you in. She did not tell you to brush your teeth. You are all by yourself. You have your head on a rock. You see a ladder. You see angels. You see the Lord, and you hear His voice. He says, “The ground you are laying on, I’m going to give to you and your seed.” Isn’t that awesome? Isn’t that awesome that God would do that to someone that had just sinned horribly? That is grace. That is grace beyond our comprehension.

We have sinned and we don’t deserve it but yet God speaks. Yet, God says, “I will do this. I am going to do this.” Even though you mess up and you are not perfect. You don’t have it all worked out. You don’t have all the pieces of the puzzle put together. You don’t either and I don’t either. We don’t have it all put together. Amen! We don’t have. However, we have a God that speaks.

He sees the vision. He sees the ladder. He sees the angels. He hears the voice of God speaking. He says, “I’m going to give unto you and your seed this land.”

Genesis 28:14 And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth, and thou shalt spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south: and in thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed.

Get this. He is not even married. He does not have a wife. He is 77 years old or 80 but he is not married. Here God is saying, “The ground that you are laying on, I’m going to give to you and your seed.” He does not have any seed. He said, “Your seed is going to be as the dust of the earth. He doesn’t even have a wife.

Do you know what? When God says He is going to do something, God does it. amen! God does those things.

Here Jacob is listening and seeing.

Genesis 28:15 And, behold, I *am* with thee, and will keep thee in all *places* whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land; for I will not leave thee, until I have done *that* which I have spoken to thee of.

God is telling a fellow that has just schemed, plotted, lied, deceived, and did all he did; God said, “Hey, I’m going to give you this ground that you are laying on and your seed.

I'm going to bless you and you are going to have seed as the dust of the earth." The next thing He says, "I am with thee."

Do you think that would encourage Jacob? Sure, it would have. How many times in life have we been there? How many times in life have we messed up and sinned, and did wrong? Yet, we went and God forgave us and God cleanses us. God says, "I have not forgotten about you. I know what you did. I know what you did. I know you sinned. I know you messed up. I know all of that. I still yet love you. I am not going to cast you away. I am not going to throw you away because you sinned."

Get this. I'm not talking about going out here and living in habitual sin every day. If you live in habitual sin every day, you sin every day, you continue doing the same thing, over and over again. You need to get saved. If you live like that then you are not going to heaven. Amen! I have no problems saying that. I have no problems saying that at all.

Listen. Sin is not going to get there. If we are going to go to heaven, it is going to be because we have faith in Almighty God. Even when we have faith in Almighty God; we still yet mess up.

The Bible says...

Genesis 28:15 And, behold, I *am* with thee, and will keep thee in all *places* whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land; for I will not leave thee, until I have done *that* which I have spoken to thee of.

Folks that is a promise that He is making to Jacob. I am going to tell you something. He has made that promise to you and me, if we will just follow Him. Do you know what God will do? I have said this here many times. When we live in the will of God, we do not have to worry about dying prematurely. Amen! When I live right, and when you live right; we don't have to worry about dying prematurely. When I live and you live and we live in the will of God, live as God wants us to live; He is first in our life then we will be here until God says it is time to go. Amen!

I don't understand why some die young, some old and some middle aged. I don't get that. You don't either. I hope you would never try to explain that because you don't know. That is all in the plan of God.

He told Jacob, "I am going to be with you wheresoever you go."

In life what I have learned is that there are some places that I don't want to go anymore. Amen! There are some places that I don't want to go in the door anymore. There used to be places that I would go where God wasn't there. Amen!

He tells Jacob here, "Wherever you go, I am going to be with you."

Do you know what I have learned? When we live in the will of God, walk in the will of God wherever we go, wherever the path He leads us; He will always be there with us.

The issue comes for me and you, when we try to think that we have this figured out on our own. When I am going to set the course, and when I am going to plot the course, and when I am going to decide what direction I am going to go; then that is when we get in trouble.

When I walk in the will of God, and when you walk in the will of God and we live that way and the course that He leads and we follow Him; He will be with us every step of the way. He will fight our battles for us. He will take care of us. He will feed us. He will clothe us. He will protect us everywhere we go. That should make us not feel lonely anymore, or ashamed, or discouraged.

There is no doubt in my mind that as Jacob is hearing all of this, his demeanor is totally changing. I know it is because what he is going to say on down through here. I know he is totally going to change.

Genesis 28:15 And, behold, I *am* with thee, and will keep thee in all *places* whither thou goest, and will bring thee again into this land; for I will not leave thee, until I have done *that* which I have spoken to thee of.

Do you know what he says? You follow me. You listen to me. I will bring you back to this land. I am going to keep you. I am going to take care of you. I am going to do with you what I told you I am going to do with you. I am going to bless you. You are going to have seed as the dust of the earth. This land is going to be yours and your seed. He says here, I am going to do that.

Folks listen. That is why it is so important that we live His will. That is why it is so important that we follow His steps.

The word *follow* is a good word. About following Jesus—it means we follow in His steps. We walk as He walks. We move as He moves. We go where He leads. That is what following is. Again, sometimes we want Him to follow us but it does not work that way. When we are following Jesus, He is there. He will take care of us. He will provide for us. He will protect us. Isn't that great to know? There is no safer place in all the world than being in the will of God. There are battles. There are struggles. There are wars. There are all kinds of things. However, there is no safer place to be than being in the will of God. Do you know why? When we are in the will of God; God has already promised He is going to take care of us. That is great!

Genesis 28:16 And Jacob awaked out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this place; and I knew *it* not.

How many times in life have you felt like Jacob? We probably all can't count that high. We felt lonely. We felt discouraged. We felt God where are you at? Why am I out here. I have sinned. I have messed up. I have done wrong. I am helpless. I am hopeless. Nobody cares about me. I am just...then God shows up. The Lord shows up.

Do you know what Jacob realized then? He realized that He was out here all along. He was right here with me all along. I was so lonely. I felt so bad. I was so ashamed. However, He was here with me all the time. That is the God of heaven folks. Does He like it when we sin? No. Does God hate sin? Definitely! Does He hate sin in my life and in your life? He does! Amen! However, there is forgiveness. There is cleansing. God will do what God promised He is going to do.

God is not somewhere in outer space like some religions wants to teach and preach that He cannot be touched. He so far out there and so far above us that He cannot be touched with the feelings of our infirmities. We know that is wrong. We know that scriptures tell us that He can be touched. He is touched with our feelings and our infirmities and all we go through... He cares. He wants to bring us back and put us in a right relationship with Him.

Do you know what Jacob was going to do? Jacob was going to do some repenting. He was going to build an altar here. He was going to pour some oil on it. He is going to sanctify it. He is going to spend some time with God. He is going to make some commitments here. He messed up and he was going to mess up some more down the road. He was a different fellow here from then on. We know that he messed up. We know that he made some mistakes. That happens sometimes in life. We do. However, he was a changed fellow. Do you know why? He was changed because the Lord showed up and the Lord spoke to him. He listened to the Lord. He did not write it off. He did not say Lord, I messed up so I will just quit. I will throw in the towel; as so many people are doing today.

Genesis 28:17 And he was afraid, and said, How dreadful *is* this place! this *is* none other but the house of God, and this *is* the gate of heaven.

Do you know what he understood? He understood that this is the only way to get there. Through the God of heaven; there is only one way to get there. There is only one avenue to get there. The Bible says in verse 18...

Genesis 28:18 And Jacob rose up early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put *for* his pillows, and set it up *for* a pillar, and poured oil upon the top of it.

Genesis 28:19 And he called the name of that place Bethel: but the name of that city *was called* Luz at the first.

So, here is Bethel. Bethel was a special place for Jacob.

Genesis 28:20 And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on,

Genesis 28:21 So that I come again to my father's house in peace; then shall the LORD be my God:

Genesis 28:22 And this stone, which I have set *for* a pillar, shall be God's house: and of all that thou shalt give me I will surely give the tenth unto thee.

Do you know what Jacob is saying here? “Lord, I am going to commit my way to you. I am going to follow you.” He had no idea what was going to happen. He did not know that mom was going to be dead and he was never going to see her again. He did not know all those things. He is going to be gone a long time. Twenty years, probably before he ever gets back here. A lot of things happen. He gets deceived. He gets lied to. All these things he had participated in all came home.

Here is what happens. When the whole thing came around; God did what He said He was going to do. He brought him right back to Bethel. Right back to this place where he had met with God, where he had made a commitment to God. He brought him right back to Bethel, right back to this place where he saw that there was only one way to heaven, where he had heard the voice of God. He understood that God was there.

Make a promise to God. “Lord, I have sinned. I have messed up. I should not have done what I have done. I am sorry. Please forgive me.” God will forgive us. He will do some great things in our life, if we will just follow Him.
